Feral Chickens at West Loch Golf Course

orkers at the West Loch Municipal Golf Course will be trimming the overgrowth and bushes along the edges of the property, starting near the 17th hole, where a large population of feral chickens has been roosting. The work is expected to be done during the month of April. Golf course employees will also meet with homeowners to address their specific requests regarding the trimming work as best as possible.

Councilmember Menor arranged for an early morning site visit on February 26th with City officials and representatives from the West Loch Fairways Homeowners Association to discuss ways of resolving the feral chicken problem. Having all stakeholders present for the site inspection was pivotal in getting the City administration to move quickly on the issue.

Councilmember Menor also raised the issue of feral chickens with Department of Enterprise Services Acting Director Tracy Kubota during a recent City Council Budget Committee meeting.

Update on Community Concerns

FY 2016 Budget Update

The following proposed amendments by Councilmember Menor to the City's FY 2016 operating and capital budgets are still alive:

- Homeless Outreach Team: \$100,000
 An outreach team would be established
 within HPD and a partnership would be
 created between police officers and
 mental health professionals and service
 providers who would work together as a
 team when making contact with the
 homeless in the community. The pro posal is modeled after a successful pro gram run by the Houston Police Depart ment.
- Old Ewa Beach Fire Station: \$100,000 The money would be used for the planning and design for the renovation of the Old Ewa Beach Fire Station for use by City emergency ambulance services. Currently, the Honolulu Fire Department is using the Old Ewa Beach Fire Station, located at 91-832 Pohakupuna Road, as a storage facility for its antique equipment.
- Transit Center for Ewa Beach: \$50,000
 Planning and design funds for a community transit center which would accommodate express, trunk and circulator bus services for Ewa Beach residents.
- Weed and Seed Program: \$250,000
 Funds would be expended to support the Weed & Seed Program's on-going efforts to address crime in communities throughout Oahu.

Cats Complaint

Councilmember Menor has sent a Request for Investigation & Service Report (RISR) to the administration on behalf of a Kauiki Street resident who complained of a stench coming from his next door neighbor's property which houses over 60 cats. Councilmember Menor will continue to follow up on this concern. **Oneula Beach Park Update**

The contract to close the large cesspool and to connect the comfort station to the sewer line is scheduled to go out to bid by April. Construction is expected to begin in September 2015 and end by Summer 2016. When completed, the Department of Parks & Recreation will check the comfort station's fixtures, plumbing and other issues to ensure the toilets and sinks are functioning properly. **Running Red Lights**

Councilmember Menor sent a RISR to the administration on behalf of a constituent who complained that motorists are running the red light at the intersection of Geiger Road and Launahele Street. Violations are occurring during morning rush hour traffic from 6 am to 8 am. Councilmember Menor will also follow up on this concern.

West Loch Elderly Village

The Department of Facility Maintenance (DFM) has determined that the pile of mulch located along a rock wall fronting the West Loch Elderly Village housing complex is coming from several trees that Verizon Wireless is required to maintain. DFM has contacted Verizon officials to notify them of their contractual responsibilities. DFM will pursue more formal remedies if Verizon Wireless does not fulfill its responsibilities.

YMCA Program

The Kalihi YMCA's Grant-in-Aid (GIA) application has been recommended for funding by the Office of Community Services for FY 2016. Councilmember Menor supports the YMCA's GIA application which would offer after-school programs for at-risk teens in Ewa, Ewa Beach and other communities in Council District 9.
