Update on Community Concerns

The following are a few of the many concerns that Councilmember Menor has been working on:

Ewa Beach Community Park

Councilmember Menor forwarded a Request for Investigation and Service Report (RISR) on behalf of a concerned Ewa Beach resident regarding individuals who are frequenting Ewa Beach Community Park and drinking alcohol at all hours of the day, including the early morning. These individuals have had several confrontations with area homeowners who have requested that the individuals keep their dogs out of the homeowners' yards. Several residents have contacted HPD regarding this issue but have not received a response as of yet. Councilmember Menor requested that HPD take immediate action to investigate this issue

Opaehuna Street Tree Maintenance

Councilmember Menor forwarded a RISR on behalf of an Ewa resident who was concerned about an overgrown Eucalyptus tree behind his property. The resident expressed concerns that the larger branches and debris from the tree could harm people using the nearby bike path as well as cause significant property damage. The RISR was forwarded to the Mayor's office and is pending assignment to the proper City department. Councilmember Menor will continue to monitor this situation and will provide further updates.

Hanakahi Street Widening

Councilmember Menor's office was contacted by State Representative Bob McDermott on behalf of Ewa Beach residents regarding the possible widening of the Hanakahi Street exit onto Fort Weaver Road in the townbound direction. The residents stated that the traffic backup in this area is caused by the lack of a dedicated right hand turn lane. The residents also believe that the City set back would allow for the installation of a full right turn lane. Councilmember Menor forwarded a RISR on behalf of the residents and it is awaiting assignment to the proper City department. Councilmember Menor will continue to monitor this situation.
