## **UPDATE ON COMMUNITY CONCERNS**

The following is an update on several of the many community issues that Councilmember Menor has been addressing:

#### Proposed Dog Park in 'Ewa

Councilmember Menor has organized a site inspection next week with City Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) Director Michele Nekota and several Ewa residents to inspect possible locations for a dog park, including the makai end of 'Ewa Mahiko Park. Councilmember Menor will provide any necessary updates in the future. Keaunui Drive Delineators

Councilmember Menor has included in his most recent submittal of budget amendments funds for the installation of traffic delineators on Keaunui Drive fronting Holomua Elementary School. The traffic delineators would be installed to prevent motorists from using the center median to bypass traffic during peak traffic hours, creating a traffic hazard.

Councilmember Menor has been working closely with Holomua Elementary School Principal Gary Yasui who brought this issue to service for their residents. GM Matyniak his attention. Councilmember Menor will continue to provide updates on this issue as the City budget process continues.

## Varona Village Update

Councilmember Menor recently met with City Managing Director Roy Amemiya to follow up on plans to renovate the Varona Village community in 'Ewa. There are two bidders on the Request For Proposals and they have until May 11 to submit their Best and Final Offer. The City will review the

submittals and make a decision. Information will be shared with the community as it becomes available

#### Kaulona Place Tree Trimming

Councilmember Menor was contacted by a resident regarding a City tree that was in need of trimming. The resident also indicated that the leaves and seeds that were falling off the tree were creating a hazard.

Councilmember Menor submitted a Request for Investigation and Service report requesting the City look into the resident's concerns. A supervisor from DPR's Division of Urban Forestry (DUF) visited the property to inspect the tree in question and determined that, while the tree posed no threat to the house, trimming was warranted. DUF anticipates that this work will be completed in June 2018.

#### **Iroquois Point Shuttle Service**

Kapilina Beach Homes General Manager Daniel Matyniak recently notified Councilmember Menor's office that the community will be providing private shuttle indicated that the ownership group at Kapilina Beach Homes surveyed their residents with proposed routes and received a positive response. The shuttle will take residents to Fort Weaver Road, as well as areas used by Kapilina Beach Homes residents such as Joint Base Pearl Harbor - Hickam. Kapilina Beach Homes is currently budgeting for this shuttle service and expect it to go into effect at the beginning of 2019. Kapilina Beach Homes is coordinating this privately with their ownership group and board of directors.
