Congratulations to all of the new graduates who received diplomas at the **University of Hawaii -West Oahu Fall 2018 Commencement Ceremony** on December 8. This year's graduating class included 307 students.

UPDATE ON COMMUNITY CONCERNS

The following is an update on several of the many community issues that Councilmember Menor has been addressing:

Geiger Road

At a previous meeting of the Ewa Neighborhood Board, Board Member Aki requested Councilmember Menor look into the removal of steel plates on Geiger Road between Kapolei Parkway and Kamakana Street. It was determined that the road work was part of a Hawaii Gas project.

Councilmember Menor contacted Hawaii Gas to relay Board Member Aki's concern and received a response from Hawaii Gas President Alicia Moy who indicated that all of the construction had been completed and the steel plates had been removed. Ms. Moy also noted that this project is the first of its kind in Hawaii and will provide Ewa Beach residents with affordable and renewable natural gas.

Renton Road Median

Councilmember Menor was contacted by an Ewa resident who indicated that the median along Renton Road had become overgrown with grass. Councilmember Menor submitted a Request for Investigation and Service Report (RISR) asking the City to clean the median. It was determined that the median was under the purview of the Ewa Villages Owner's Association and that maintenance work had been scheduled. Councilmember Menor is pleased to report that the association has trimmed all of the overgrown grass along the median. **Ewa Villages Golf Course**

Councilmember Menor was contacted by an Ewa Villages resident who reported that brush along the Ewa Villages Golf Course fence line had become overgrown. Councilmember Menor submitted a RISR requesting the City to trim back the overgrowth. The Department of Enterprise Services (DES) reported that their staff has trimmed the vegetation and also applied herbicide to retard further growth in the area. The DES administrator also indicated that the department will continue to monitor the fence lines for areas in need of attention.



On December 4, Councilmember Menor joined Mayor Kirk Caldwell, Honolulu Police Chief Susan Ballard, and other community stakeholders at the groundbreaking ceremony for Hale Kipa's Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Campus. The new multipurpose campus is located along Old Fort Weaver Road and will serve as Hale Kipa's headquarters and will also consolidate the nonprofit agency's numerous community programs under one roof. The campus will include residential shelters, a service center, and an education administration building.



On December 8, Councilmember Menor joined Mickey and Minnie Mouse from Aulanii Resort at the opening ceremonies of Kapolei City Lights. The evening included prize drawings, live entertainment, the annual West Oahu Electric Light Parade, and a tree lighting ceremony which Councilmember Menor participates in each year.
