UPDATE ON COMMUNITY CONCERNS

The following is an update on several of the many community issues that Councilmember Menor has been addressing:

'Ewa Parks Update

On September 1, the City will begin securing park facilities in several Oahu districts as an extension of a successful pilot project that proved successful in preventing vandalism in City parks. Comfort stations, park facilities, and parking lots will be closed at 'Ewa Mahiko District Park and 'Ewa Beach Community Park. Closures will run from 10 p.m. until 5 a.m.

Driver Licensing Renewals

At the City Council's September 12 meeting, the Council adopted Resolution 18-150 which urges the City Department of Customer Services to fill departmental vacancies, provide more driver licensing appointments, and offer State identification services at additional locations. The resolution was adopted in response to an increased demand for driver licensing and State identification services that has increased lines and wait times at all Driver Licensing Centers.

The Council also adopted Resolution 18-174 which requests that the City

administration consider pre-screening applicants, extended weekday hours at Satellite City Halls, permanent weekend hours, dedicated appointments for kupuna and other amenities for kupuna drivers.

Commercial Driver's License (CDL)

Councilmember Menor was recently contacted by Representative Bob McDermott who notified him that the City is in dire need of more CDL road test examiners. The current shortage of examiners has led to a backlog of applicants who are awaiting an opportunity to complete the testing required to obtain their CDL license. Councilmember Menor has submitted a Request for Investigation and Service Report (RISR) asking the City to investigate and address this matter.

Bill 61 (2018)

Bill 61 (2018) was heard at the City Council's October 3 meeting and will receive an additional hearing in the Transportation Committee. This bill, if approved, will require public notice, input, and engagement whenever the City administration proposes the removal of a marked crosswalk. These requirements will also apply when a crosswalk is anticipated to be removed as part of a street or highway repaving project.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROJECTS

The project will provide 320 affordable rental units. Most of these units will be offered to residents whose incomes are at or below 80% of the Area Median Income (AMI) and for whom affordable housing is an urgent need.
