UPDATE ON COMMUNITY CONCERNS

City Budget

The City Council is currently in its first round of hearings concerning the City Budget for Fiscal Year 2019-2020. Councilmember Menor will be submitting several district budget requests including repairs to the Leeward Bike Path and the installation of speed tables on Kuhina Street.

Illegal Vacation Rentals

Councilmembers Menor and Joey Manahan introduced Bill 85 (2018) to address illegal vacation rentals. There are over 10,000 vacation rentals on Oahu and thousands are operating illegally. The proliferation of illegal vacation rentals is a major problem that requires immediate and effective action by the City. It reduces the inventory of badly-needed affordable rentals and can negatively affect the character of neighborhoods.

Bill 85 would hold hosting platforms like Airbnb and VRBO accountable for facilitating illegal transactions. It requires the platforms to share data about the vacation rentals with the City's enforcement team. It establishes strong fines and penalties. Bill 85 also empowers residents to assist City officials in identifying and reining in illegal activity.

Bill 85 (2018) will be heard at the March 18 special meeting of the Committee on Planning.

Red Hill Fuel Storage Facility

Resolution 18-266 was passed out of the Committee on Public Infrastructure, Technology, and Sustainability on February 26. This resolution urges the Environmental Protection Agency and State Department of

Health to reject the approval of a single wall tank upgrade at the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility, and to support the secondary containment tank upgrade alternative option, or if secondary containment is determined to be infeasible, to support the relocation of the fuel tanks away from the aquifer. Resolution 18-266 was adopted at the City Council's March 8 meeting.

Look All Ways

On February 20, Councilmember Menor joined Mayor Caldwell, the Honolulu Police Department (HPD), AARP Hawaii, MADD Hawaii, and the Honolulu Bicycling League to announce "Look All Ways," a seven-point initiative meant to increase the safety of pedestrians, cyclists, and drivers. The initiative will include the installation of physical safety measures, the development of the Oahu Pedestrian Plan, roving DUI enforcement by HPD, and the new "Look All Ways" public service announcement campaign that will air on local television and radio stations.

In conjunction with "Look All Ways,"
Councilmember Menor submitted Resolution
19-32 which requests that the City
administration work with the City Council to
develop a pedestrian safety conference
which would bring together government
officials, traffic safety experts, law
enforcement, and other interested
stakeholders. Resolution 19-32 was adopted
at the March 8 meeting of the City Council.

Varona Village

Councilmember Ron Menor continues to push for the redevelopment of Varona Village. A development agreement is currently being negotiated between the City and the developer who was selected to oversee the redevelopment of Varona Village. This is a high priority for Councilmember Menor and he will closely monitor the progress of the project.
