

UPDATE ON COMMUNITY CONCERNS

The following is an update on several of the many community issues that

Councilmember Menor has been addressing:

Renton Road Damage

Board Member John Rogers requested that the City consider restricting heavy work trucks from driving along Renton Road as these vehicles have damaged the road on multiple occasions. Councilmember Menor submitted a Request for Investigation and Service Report (RISR) requesting the City consider Board Member Roger's suggestion. He will continue to monitor this issue.

Asing Community Park Sprinklers

Board Member Jason Locke reported that the sprinkler system at Asing Community Park had been damaged and that the grass in the area had dried out. Councilmember Menor submitted a RISR asking the City to repair the sprinkler system as soon as possible. He will provide an update when this work has been completed.

Ewa Mahiko District Park Gym

On April 26, Councilmember Menor conducted a site inspection at Ewa Mahiko

District Park Gym and observed areas that need to be repaired. He has submitted a RISR requesting that the City address the following issues: a leaking HVAC system that has created water damage in numerous areas; a leak in the roof above the basketball court that has damaged the floor and the lighting system; damaged light fixtures above the basketball court; and clogged ventilation slats around the basketball court that are restricting air flow into the gym.

Councilmember Menor will push for the City to have these repairs completed and provide any necessary updates.

Ewa Mahiko District Park

Councilmember Menor previously met with members of the Ewa Beach Little League regarding needed improvements at Ewa Mahiko District Park which is used by the league for practices and games. In an effort to address their concerns, Councilmember Menor has inserted funds in the City Budget for these improvements. These monies will be used to install bleachers and a storage container at the park.
