Message from Councilmember Ron Menor



On November 13, 2019, the City Council Budget Committee passed out a bill that I introduced to benefit high school students in Ewa Beach. Bill 55 (2019) authorizes the City Department of Transportation Services to set up a pilot program for high school students to receive free bus passes to attend off-campus or after-school internship opportunities. The pilot program is strongly supported by the Campbell/Kapolei School Complex.



Do you have a gold star on your driver's license or State ID? Beginning October 1, 2020, licenses and State IDs without the gold star will not be accepted by Federal agencies, including TSA.
