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Message from Councilmember Ron Menor

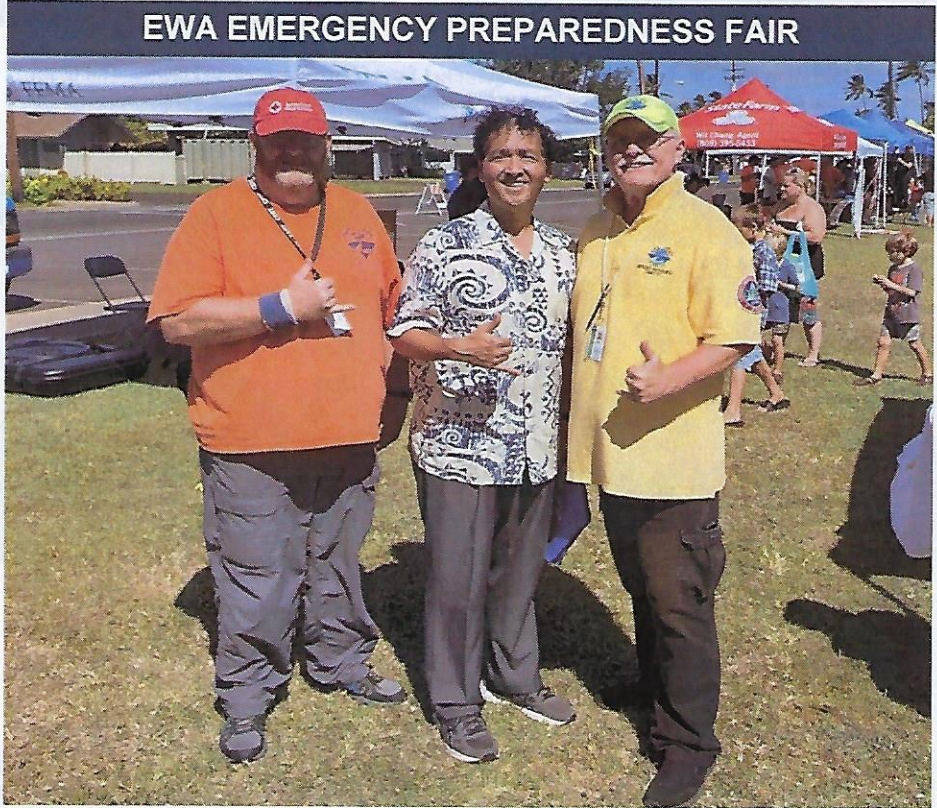
With summer coming to an end and the beginning of the new school year, I would like to extend my best wishes to our students as they continue through their academic journey!

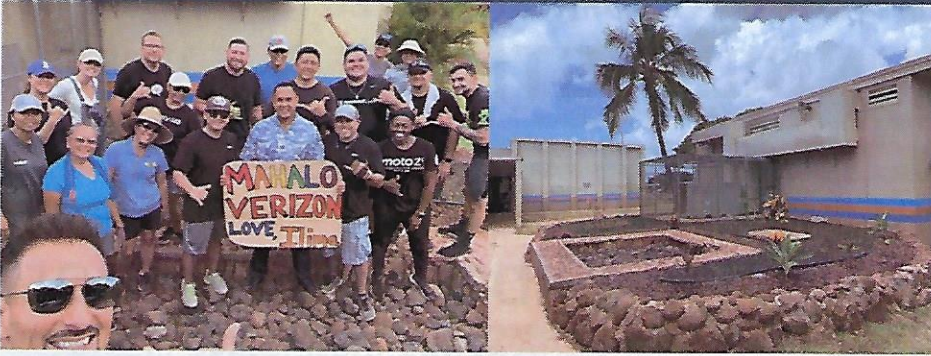

KULANA HALE GROUNDBREAKING



Councilmember Menor participated in the groundbreaking for Phase 2 of the \$130 million Kulana Hale mixed-use affordable senior and multi-family apartment community in Kapolei. This phase adds a second 13-story high-rise tower with 143 affordable units for families, and approximately 2,300 square feet of ground floor retail space. The first phase which includes a 13-story high-rise is currently under construction and will provide 154 affordable units for seniors.
