I'd like to update you on Bill 56 (2019) CD1, relating to bus passes. I introduced this bill to establish a pilot program at James Campbell High School and Kapolei High School to provide subsidized bus passes for students to attend off-campus or after-school internships. The bill passed out of the Budget Committee on February 26, 2020 and is poised for passage at the March 18, 2020 Council meeting.

COMMUNITY UPDATE

Kapapapuhi Point Park

Ewa Neighborhood Board Member John Rogers alerted Councilmember Menor of the deteriorating piers and gazebos at Kapapapuhi Point Park. The park has 16 piers and 2 gazebos which are often used by families, residents and the community. Councilmember Menor followed up with the City administration on this issue and will update the Ewa Neighborhood Board when he receives a response. Additionally, Councilmember Menor is requesting funds in the FY21 budget for the necessary repairs.

LED Street Lights

Councilmember Menor continues to receive reports of the new LED street light bulbs not functioning properly. A constituent recently reported that there are street lights that are out in Ewa Villages. If a street light is out in your neighborhood, please do not hesitate to contact Councilmember Menor's office so that he can report the problem directly to the City Dept. of Design and Construction. **Ewa Villages Overgrowth and**

Abandoned Vehicles

Councilmember Menor received a concern regarding a few properties in Ewa Villages where overgrowth needs to be removed. Additionally, there are vehicles with no license plates parked at the properties. Councilmember Menor followed up with the City administration and is awaiting a response. He will continue to monitor this issue.

Tenney Street Drainage

A constituent reported an issue of water collecting in the middle of Tenney Street in Ewa Villages. Councilmember Menor reported the issue to the City Department of Facility Maintenance (DFM). Subsequently, a crew from DFM's Pearl City Division of Road Maintenance cleaned the grated inlets on Tenney Street on February 27, 2020. Honouliuli Healing Garden

It was reported to Councilmember Menor that an individual repeatedly camps in the brush area near the Honouliuli Healing Garden's driveway. Councilmember Menor followed up with HPD and DFM to address this issue. HPD's District 8 Community Policing Team made contact with the individual and informed him of the complaint. He voluntarily left the area with his belongings. Officers will continue to make periodic checks and take appropriate enforcement action. Additionally, DFM's Stored Property Ordinance (SPO) and Sidewalk Nuisance Ordinance Team (SNO), with assistance of HPD conducted enforcement on January 10, 2020 at this location and will continue to monitor this area in the future.
